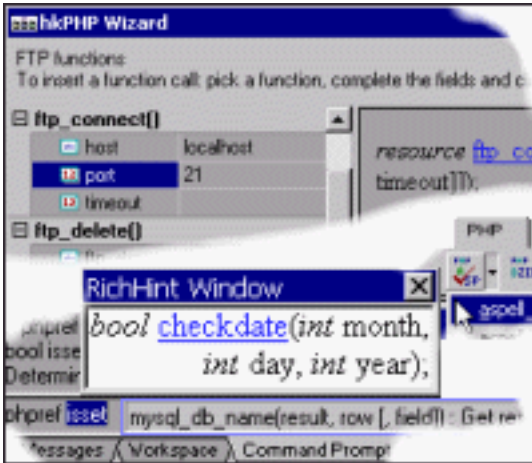

Description

Extends HTML-Kit's support for PHP 4.x by adding the ability to lookup, construct and insert over 3,000 categorized functions.

Features:

- Adds a new Actions Bar tab with categorized menus for inserting standard and optional PHP functions.
- Brief function descriptions on the menus and longer descriptions with function parameters on the Status Bar.
- Ability to lookup function descriptions inside HTML-Kit's Command Prompt window.
- Wizards for constructing functions.
- RichHints with function arguments.
- Ability to lookup online help on the HelpZone.

Requirements

- HTML-Kit Build 292 or 290

Common Questions

Q: How do I install hkPHP?

A: Download the "hkPHP" plugin. It's not necessary to unzip the *.zip file, HTML-Kit will expand it to the appropriate directory during the installation.

Select "Install | Install Plugin" from HTML-Kit's "Tools" menu. Point to the downloaded *.zip file and click "OK."

If any additional prompts appear, follow them to complete the installation.

Q: How do I run it?

A: PHP

hkPHP's icon will appear on the "PHP" tab on HTML-Kit's Actions Bar. It can also be invoked from the "Actions | PHP" sub menu.

Q: Whats' the quickest way to uninstall hkPHP?

A: Right click the hkPHP icon on the Actions Bar and select "Uninstall." Alternatively, the "Tools | Install | Uninstall Plugins" menu option in HTML-Kit can be used to uninstall this and other plugins.

Q: Do I need the exact versions of software listed under the Requirements?

A: The versions listed are the minimum versions required by this plugin. For example, a plugin that requires HTML-Kit Build 290 will run on HTML-Kit Build 292 as well.

Q: What's the best way to check which version of HTML-Kit I'm using?

A: The build number can be found on the "About" dialog, which is located on HTML-Kit's "Help" menu.

Q: What's the command for looking up functions inside the Command Prompt window?

A: Select "Window | Command Prompt" from the main menu and enter phpref followed by the name of the PHP function. For example, to view a description of the isset() function, enter: phpref isset
