Description

Keyword help file for Perl 5.6+ distributions that include documentation with multiple function definitions per file. Supports both online and offline versions of the Perl documentation. To use local / offline documents, the ItemPrefix parameter in the *.hkh file must be changed to point to the local folder with Perl help files (such as C:\Perl\html\lib\pod\ assuming Perl is installed under C:\Perl\). To use online help files, remove the ";" character in front of the ItemPrefixAlt parameter. The "Perl Reference" keyword help file maybe required to access older and/or online versions of the Perl documentation.

Common Questions

Q: How do I install nsPerl?

A: Download the "nsPerl" keyword help file. It's not necessary to unzip the *.zip file, HTML-Kit will expand it to the appropriate directory during the installation.

Select "Install | Keyword Help File" from HTML-Kit's "Tools" menu. Point to the downloaded *.zip file and click "OK."

To test the installation: place the cursor on one of the supported keywords and press the F1 key.

Q: How do I use it?

A: Place the cursor on one of the keywords covered by it

and press the F1 key. A context-sensitive help window will appear with the help content or any additional references.

Q: How can the "nsPerl" related help items be disabled?

A: Open the Preferences dialog using the "Edit | Preferences" main menu option and change to the "Help" tab. Uncheck the help file in question from the "Keyword help files" list.

Q: How do I create or modify a keyword help reference?

A: Details on how to create keyword help files can be found in the support documents section.

Q: Do I need the exact versions of software listed under the Requirements?

A: The versions listed are the minimum versions required by this plugin. For example, a plugin that requires HTML-Kit Build 290 will run on HTML-Kit Build 292 as well.

Q: What's the best way to check which version of HTML-Kit I'm using?

A: The build number can be found on the "About" dialog, which is located on HTML-Kit's "Help" menu.
